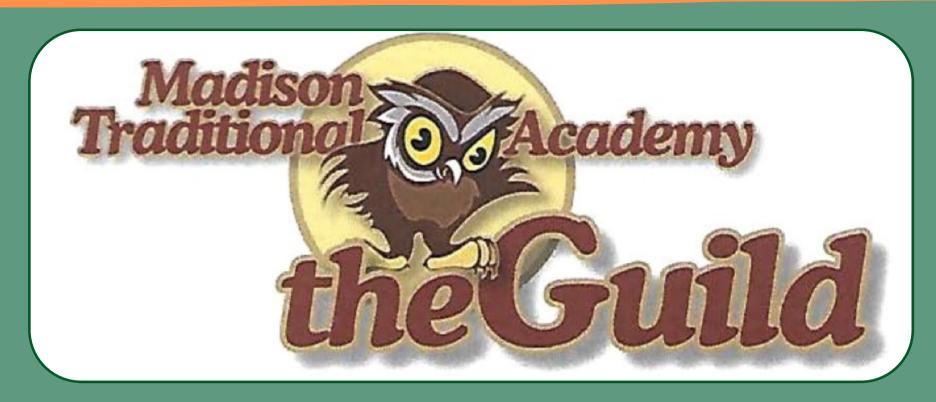

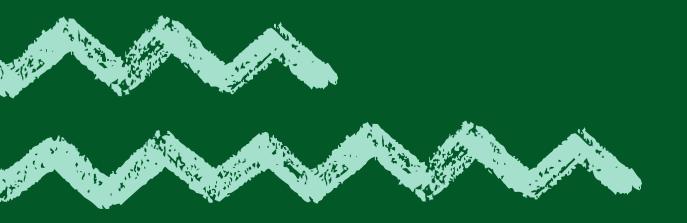

The class with the highest number of Guild members wins a pizza party with Principal Merrill!

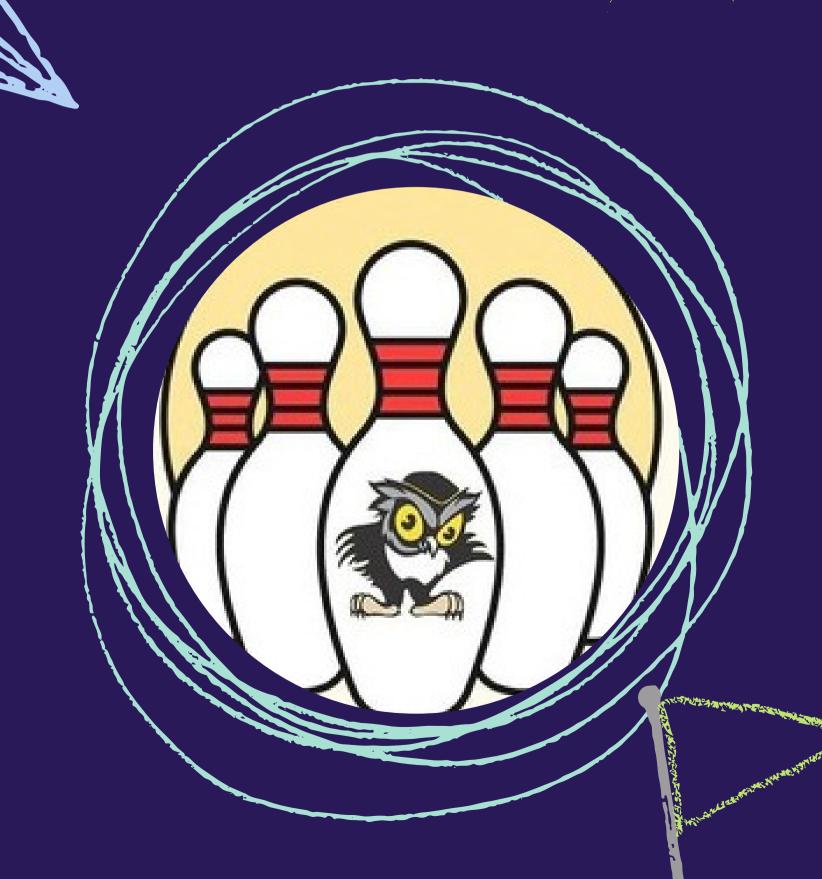

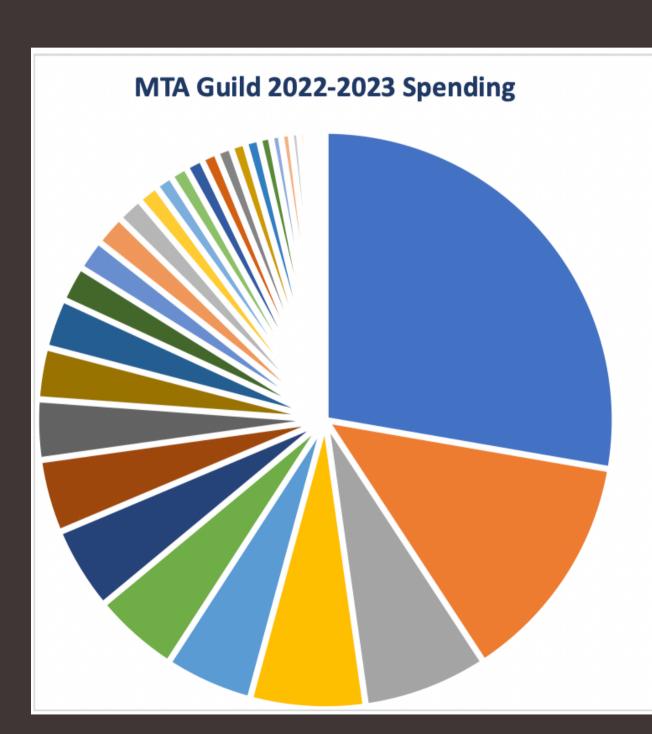

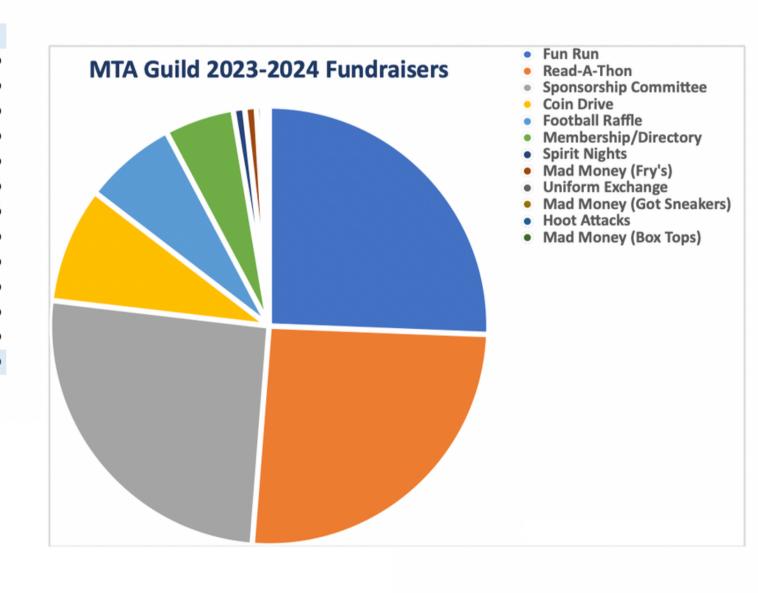
