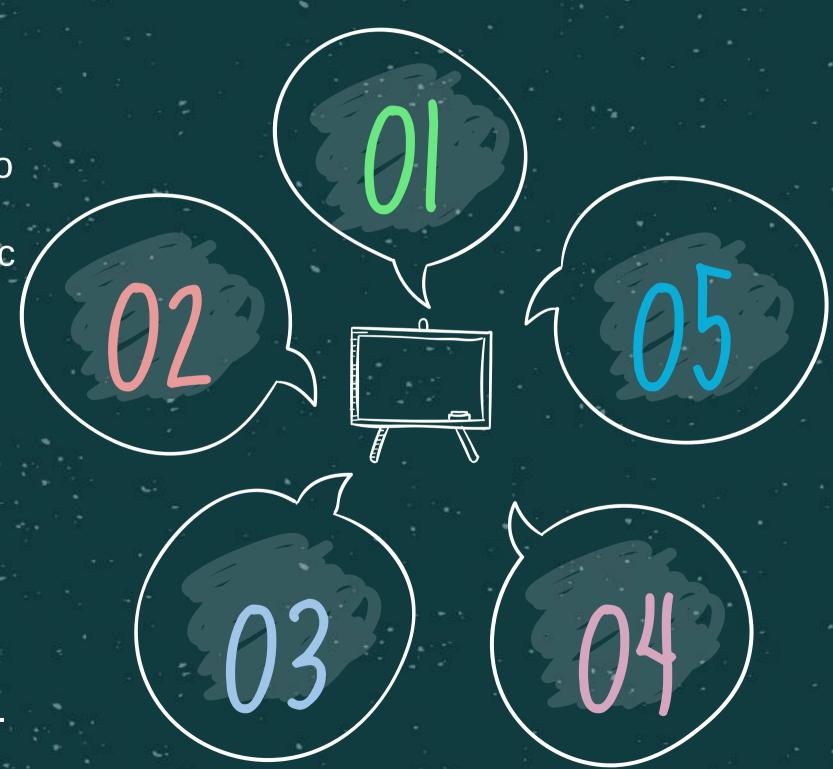


WHY DO WE NEED ANOTHER BOND?

LACK OF INVESTMENT BY THE STATE

Because Arizona continues to rank at the bottom of nearly every funding category, public schools are forced to heavily (bonds/overrides) The state's Building Renewal Grant program does not pay for preventative maintenance

SAFE SCHOOLS Our kids need a safe and secure learning environment.

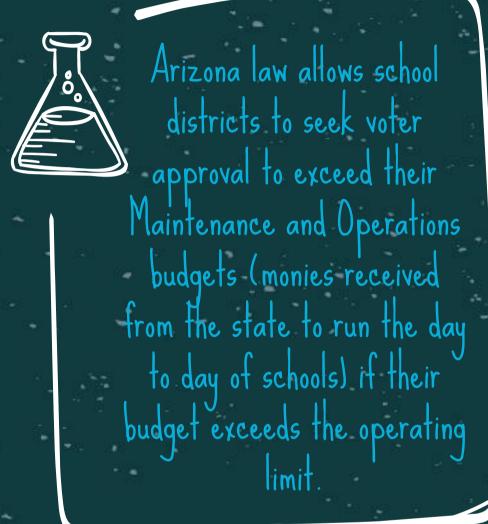


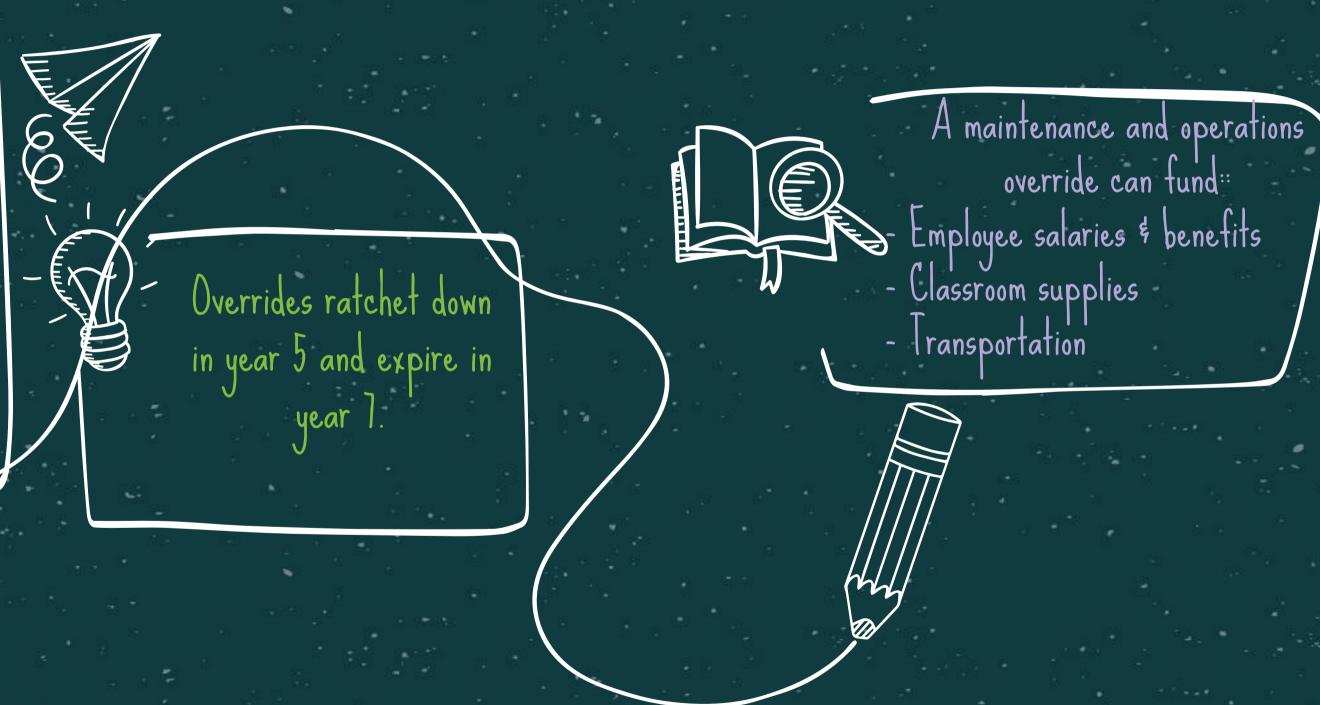

Recruit and retain highly qualified teachers and staff

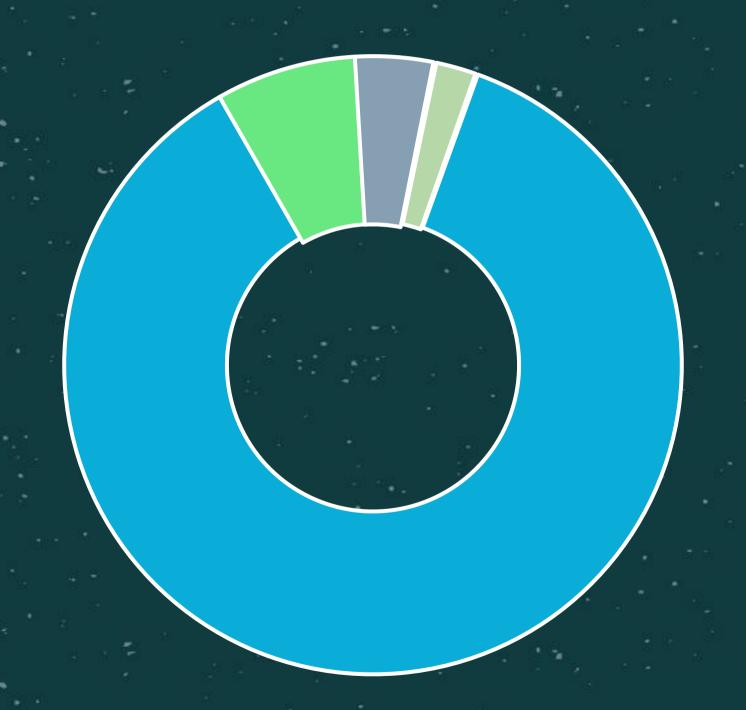

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

BUT WHY DO WE NEED A BOND AND AN OVERRIDE?

Bonds and overrides are in different buckets and used to fund different items



Must be used to fund capital projects that have a useful lifespan of greater than 5 years

M&O OVERRIDES

used for running the schools

Funds from one bucket canNOT be used in another bucket

WILL THIS INCREASE MY TAXES?

If the bond and override pass, taxes will NOT increase. A "yes/yes" vote will maintain the current tax rate.



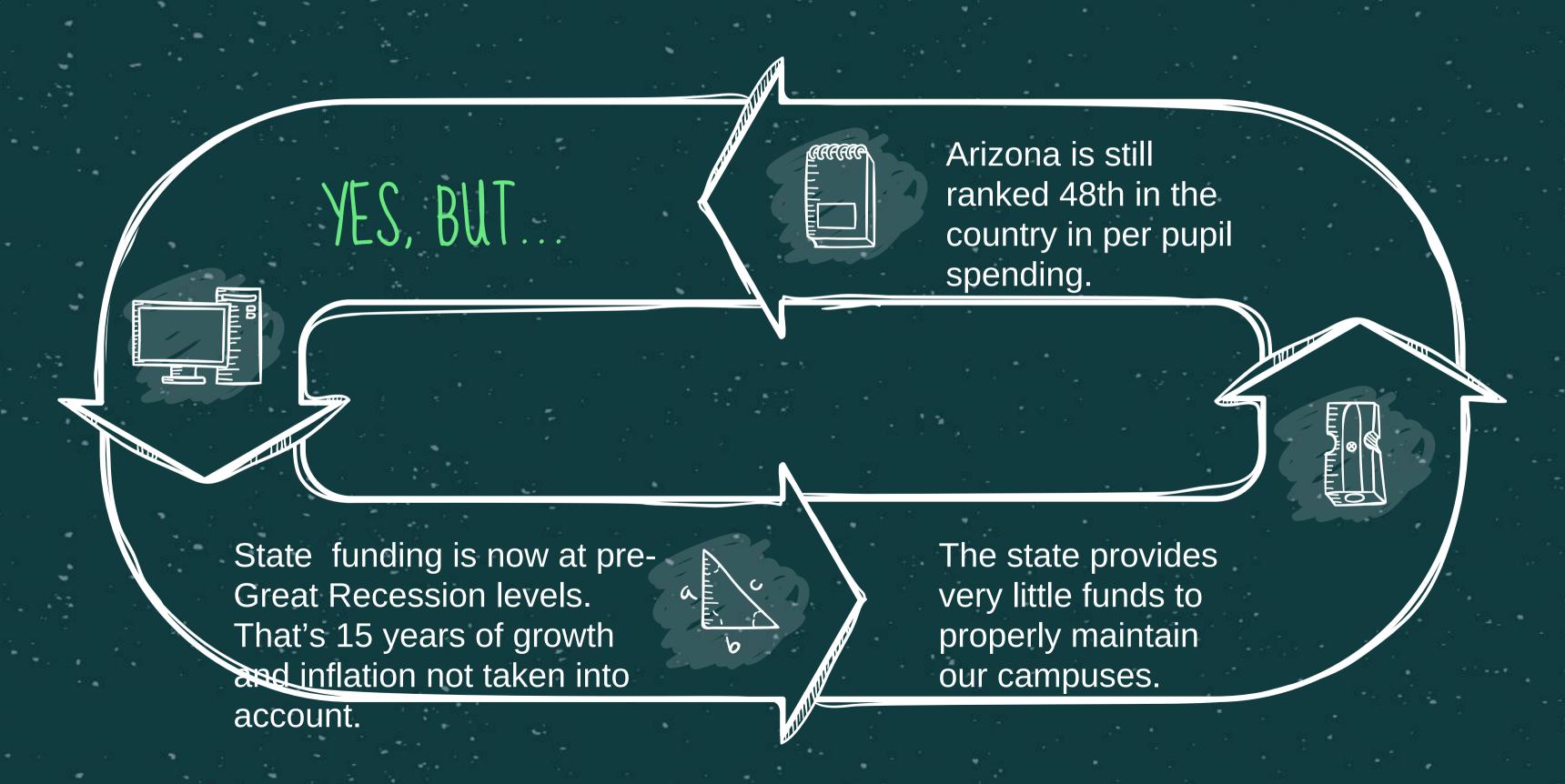
The property tax rate of the Madison School District is one of the lowest in the area.



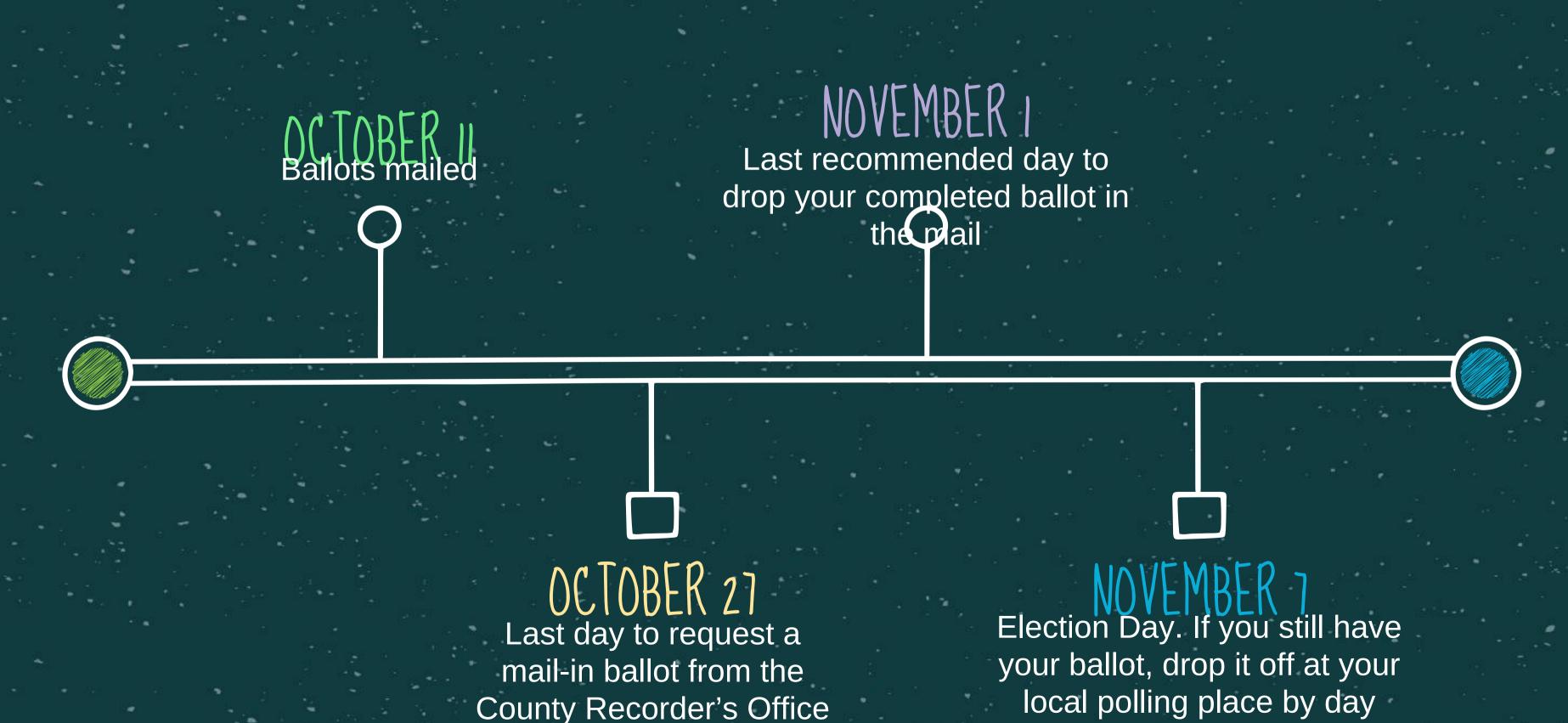
Madison's good fiscal management has lead to a reduction in the property tax rate EACH of the last 4 years.
