 - 1. Casey George with Saxon Saxon math is going away so currently piloting 2 programs
 - 2. Both curriculums are available in the front office for review by any parent
 - Q: Is Saxon really going away?
 - Q: Can we get an official statement from publisher that this is going away?
 - A: Published through 2024 but after that publishing will stop. Materials will stop being updated after that but can still be used
 - Q: How are the students being graded that are piloting these programs?
 - A: Teachers have complete control over the grade. The Math curriculum companies have been brought in to help provide support to teachers. Teacher goal is to ensure that each grade level is proficient at the objectives for that grade
 - Q: What supplemental support can you provide students? Tom Horne just provided 40 million in funding for tutoring. Is MTA eligible for that?
 - A: Nothing currently exists and will look into the funding for tutoring

- Q: Does the district allow additional funding for tutoring because we are a signature program?
- A: Will look into this
- Q: Can parents have printed materials at home?
- A: Answer unknown. Next meeting with publisher is 9/27 so will ask
- Q: What metrics are being used to determine what program will be used to go forward?
- A: Will use teacher's input. There is not a concrete metric for selection but the kids will still be evaluated on the MAP scale
- Q: Can testing be done after each program to determine level of comprehension vs other students using Saxon
- Q: Other schools in Madison offer teachers additional money to assist with after school tutoring. Is that available at MTA?
- A: MTA teachers are not usually interested in this because they make more privately. MTA has private tutoring established which parents can schedule outside of the school.
- Q: Has a deep dive been done into Math in Focus or Reveal Math by McGrawHill? A: No
- Q: Is the curriculum similar or different in each program?
- A: They are very different
- We need implementation specialists for the programs to assist the teachers with implementation
- Q: Can the Guild put together a proposal that will pay teachers money to provide additional tutoring support to classes that are piloting?
